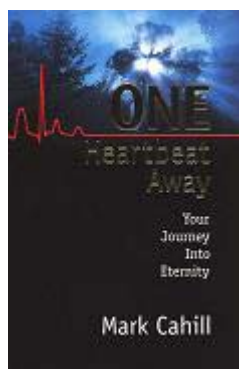
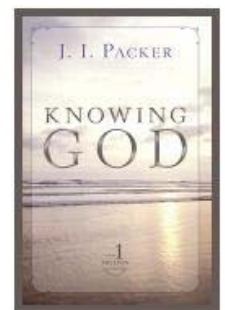


Because the Time is Near by John MacArthur

One Heartbeat Away by Mark Cahill

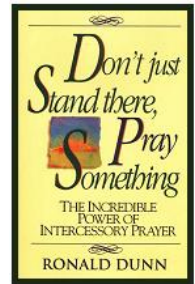

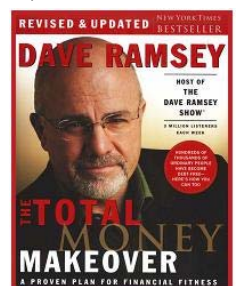
Real Change by Newt Gingrich

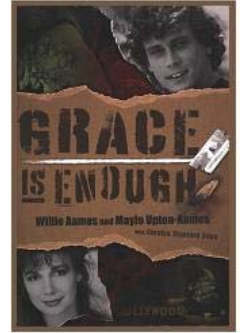

Black Sea Affair by Don Brown

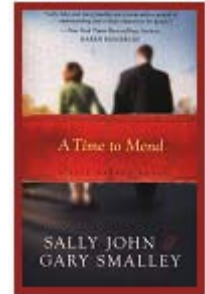

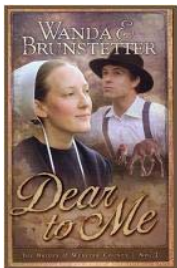
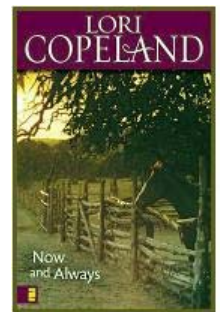


The Shack by William P. Young
